Background:

- The State Workforce Development Board established a Disability Access Committee to lead a Statewide Disability Access Initiative to:
 - 1) Ensure that Iowa's one-stop delivery system meets all accessibility requirements for individuals with disabilities under the Iowa Civil Rights Act of 1965, as amended (ICRA); the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990, as amended (ADA); and the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA).
 - 2) Increase accessibility for individuals with disabilities to the programs, services, and activities of Iowa's one-stop delivery system.
 - 3) Continuously improve for individuals with disabilities the provision of services within the one-stop delivery system.
 - 4) Improve opportunities for individuals with disabilities in competitive integrated employment.

Access Issue:	Front approach to the pull side of the door does not have at least 18 inches (measures 13 inches) of maneuvering clearance beyond the latch side plus 60 inches of clear depth. Reconfigure stalls and move hinges for the door to open the opposite way.

Access Issue:	Door requires 6.5 pounds of maximum force to open. Adjust or replace closers so doors can be opened easily with 5 pounds maximum force.

Access Issue:	The mirror is located above the lavatory and the bottom edge measures 49 inches. The mirror should be no higher than 40 inches above the floor. Lower mirror or install a full length mirror in the toilet room.

Access Issue:	Coat hooks measure 65 inches and should be no greater than 48 inches above the floor. Adjust hooks or provide additional accessible coat hook.

Access Issue:	At least one lavatory does not have a clear floor space for a forward approach at least 30 inches wide and 48 inches long as the vanity restricts approach. Alter or replace lavatory.

Access Issue:	There is not at least 27 inches of clearance from the floor to the bottom of the lavatory that extends at least 8 inches under the lavatory for knee clearance. There is no toe clearance available at least 9 inches high. Alter or replace lavatory.

Access Issue:	The centerline of the water closet measures 26 ½ inches from the side wall or partition. The centerline should be no less than 16 inches and no more than 18 inches from the side wall or partition.

Access Issue:	Clearance provided around the water closet measures 54 inches from the side wall and 71 inches from the rear wall. The clearance should measure at least 60 inches from the side wall and at least 56 inches from the rear wall. Alter room compartment for clearance.
